Dear People of Christ Church,

This past month, the Winchester Downtown Clergy Fellowship had one of our best attended meetings in several years, which was a wonderful indicator of the energy in the greater area to be together once again.

The Winchester Downtown Clergy Fellowship is a long-standing group which includes the downtown churches, Beth El Synagogue, the Winchester Islamic Society, and other churches around the Winchester area. Fellowship is a large component of our meetings as the clergy and religious leaders gather to share what is going on in our communities, struggles common among faith leaders, and celebrations in the communities.

This past meeting, we celebrated the retirement of the Rev. Dan McCoig of First Presbyterian Church as their Senior Pastor. It was wonderful to say thank you for our years of work together in Winchester.

As part of our regular time together, we also discussed what is going on among our different communities. This time was similar to others as we discussed changes among our parish attendance going through and coming out of COVID, sharing different strategies and efforts among our programs and parishes, and realizing how growth is happening around the area. In these conversations, we also discussed topics the Downtown Clergy will want to explore in greater detail as we set up our annual clergy retreat this winter.

During my tenure at Christ Church, I have always enjoyed this unique fellowship of our faith communities. Such fellowship is not found in many towns and cities. WATTS and CCAP are perhaps our best known joint efforts for our congregations to care for the poor, the homeless and the vulnerable. Another reflection of the fellowship is when Winchester's Christian congregations gather on the downtown mall for our Palm Sunday service. This service helps Winchester see how many Christians are active in the community. Again, such fellowship is not found all the time and I am thankful for the opportunity to participate as clergy and to witness the Christ Church family participating in the local community, too.

The Rt. Rev'd E. Mark Stevenson, Bishop of the Diocese of Virginia, announced recently the appointment of the Rev. Chanta Bhan as the Diocese's first Canon for Discipleship. She will start on October 1, 2023.

Canon Bhan will articulate and proclaim a vision for discipleship of clergy and lay ministers in the Diocese. She will work in partnership with congregations to support their work with children and family ministries, Shrine Mont Camps, Parish Youth Ministry, campus ministries, and adult formation programs. She will help empower robust vocational discernment for laity, expand networks of formation professionals, and strengthen opportunities for pastoral care for formation leaders. From the Treasurer

Donations to the Church via IRAs

A reminder for retirees with Individual Retirement Arrangement (IRA) accounts: Those of us who have reached a certain age have an annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). Failure to withdraw the full RMD by December 31st has a tax penalty, so be sure to take your RMD on time.

IRA distributions are taxed as income, so you may be paying 12%, 15%, or even more in taxes on your RMD each year. Changes in the tax law a few years ago increased the standard deduction, so maybe we don't deduct our charitable contributions as an itemized deduction anymore.

Talk with your tax advisor about a special provision in the tax code for IRAs that lets us avoid some of the income tax. Charitable contributions made to Christ Church are considered a qualified distribution, and are not taxable as long as you have the distribution sent directly from your IRA account to the church. This means the full 100% distribution can go to the church.

IRS Publication 590-B, Distributions from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs) spells out the rules, limits, and restrictions for an IRA. Again, please consult with your tax advisor about your specific situation.

How your Pledge Impacts Ministry: Parish Life

The purpose of Parish Life and Fellowship is to gather and care for our parish family. We create opportunities for fellowship and bring members of our church family together to form relationships. We also strive to warmly welcome all visitors to the church and engage newcomers in the life of our church. Functions and volunteers who fall under Parish Life include Coffee Hour, Sunday service greeters, Men's Group, OWLs (Older, Wiser Laity) and newcomer programs. In addition, there are receptions, the parish picnic and the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper.

All ministries benefit from Parish Life, and all work together to form the whole body of Christ Church. For example, greeters participate in worship. Men's Group participates in Outreach (Winchester Rescue Mission, WATTS, etc.). Coffee hour is sometimes hosted by different ministries to increase awareness. And, receptions are held in conjunction with worship and other special services.

Parish Life operates as a committee, and depends on parishioners who volunteer their time and donate food and other items to help with these events. While they rely on the generosity of church members, they also use church funds to maintain the kitchen and purchase supplies. The food for this year's Parish Picnic, which was well attended, was paid for from the church budget. Additionally, there is the expense of the building, maintenance and utilities, as well as clergy and staff, who spend about 15% of their time in planning, scheduling, communications, expense tracking, and participating in Parish Life.

The Parish Life Committee is happy to see an increase in participation in Sunday Coffee Hour and receptions. People or groups who host Coffee Hour, typically provide food, but the coffee and other beverages are paid for by the church.

We would like to continue to expand Parish Life with more fellowship opportunities, but this requires a bigger budget (only possible through increased pledging) and more volunteers. Whenever we welcome a sister or brother, we welcome Christ, Himself.

How your Pledge Impacts Ministry: Worship

Worship at Christ Church is the light of our communal life as people of faith. We gather to offer thanks and praise, to be fed and nurtured, to be renewed and sent out. We gather at different times of our lives. Services throughout the week include Sunday services and services at Westminster Canterbury. Other services include funerals, weddings, children's chapel, retreats, and special services in the community. It is appropriate that a large part of our gifts of time, talent, and money support our worship. Overall, Worship accounts for 35% of our annual operating budget; it is the largest part and the heart of our parish. There are many ministries which can go unnoticed because they help enhance our worship with as few distractions as possible. It makes sense that a large part of our clergy, staff, volunteers, properties, and support supplies/services go to our worship life.

We have many people, both paid and volunteer, involved with preparing and conducting our worship programs. Clergy plans and leads services, prepares sermons, provides liturgical leadership, and coordinates with all who contribute to worship services, especially staff. Music is an integral part of our worship. The music director (a paid position) and choir do much of their work behind the scenes in preparation and practice. Volunteers for worship include those serving as Lay Eucharistic Ministers, readers, acolytes, altar guild, choirs, and ushers.

Our worship happens in a beautiful historic church, which requires ongoing maintenance, repair, and support. The church pays for fire alarm and security systems, property and liability insurance, HVAC systems, gas, electric, water and sewage systems, and internet. Our sexton (paid) provides routine maintenance, care, house-keeping, and minor repairs for all our facilities. He also helps setting up and taking down for parish events.

In addition to the sexton and music director, Christ Church staff provides vital support for our worship through preparing of the bulletins, keeping the church worship calendar, working with ministries such as altar guild and laity scheduling, handling the organ tuning, paying the copyright fees for our music (and all other bills related to worship), and live streaming our services.

The considerable time and effort our clergy, staff, and volunteers, combined with the properties and support supplies/services, all come together to create our worship life at Christ Church. Each of these ministries, though they may be largely unnoticed individually, are all vital to our communal life as people of faith. These ministries show the vitality and care people have in serving our Lord. Your pledge supports all of these necessary components of worship.

Updates on Vaccines

It's vaccine season! There are three vaccines that are recommended in the fall, and especially important for individuals age 60 and older: Flu. Covid-19, and the new RSV shot.

It is important for everyone to have a yearly Flu vaccine (unless you're allergic to the vaccine). This vaccine can keep you from getting sick with the flu. It can reduce severity of illness in those who get the flu. It can reduce the risk of flu-associated hospitalizations. It's especially important as a preventative for people with certain chronic health conditions and can be a lifesaver for children.

The CDC now recommends a single dose of the COVID-19 vaccine for most people six months and older. Some people may need an additional dose to be "caught up," so check with your health care provider, especially if you are immune-compromised.

The new RSV vaccine can prevent lower-respiratory tract disease caused by the respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). The CDC recommends the vaccine for adults 60 and up and some pregnant women. RSV is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms (runny nose, cough, decreased appetite, fever, wheezing) and is spread through direct contact with the virus (droplets from other's cough or sneeze contacting your eyes, nose or mouth). RSV can be more serious for infants, older adults, and people with chronic conditions: heart or lung disease, weakened immune systems, and living in nursing homes.

You can get these three vaccines at local pharmacies, usually without an appointment. It's a good idea to call and confirm vaccines are available before you go. You can get all three shots in the same visit, but you must be sure to get Covid-19 in one arm and flu and RSV in the other arm.

Presentation on Memory Loss Issues

Dr. John Lewis is a psychologist and an expert in the evaluation of capacity and memory loss. Kate Devolites is Executive Director of the Adult Care Center (ACC). The ACC cares for clients with memory loss, cognitive changes, and Alzheimer's disease. And a representative from Westminster-Canterbury's memory loss unit will be on hand. We'll discuss memory loss in today's world, ways to look out for both the patient and the family for the best care, local resources available and the experts will answer questions. We hope this will be beneficial for those concerned about their own memory loss and all who are or may be caregivers.
